PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Children today need Christmas more than ever. Not for the gifts and presents - most children get their fair share throughout the year. They need Christmas for the escape, and for the mystery and magic that is associated with childhood. There are few secrets left for children these days. In this information-age they are bombarded with news and views of all sorts. Childhood was once a type of secret garden that was full of mysteries. The wider world was there to be discovered by children, rather than something that was thrust upon them. Christmas, for all its commercialism, still has its mystery and magic. Perhaps, once a year we all still want to believe in the magic; we are always on the lookout for activities that anchor us back to our childhoods. I hope that all members of our school community have the opportunity over the Christmas break to refamiliarise themselves with the joy of Christmas from a child's perspective - the message of hope that is intrinsic to the Christmas story endures and it is through our children and our influence on others that hope prevails.

The great American educator, John Dewey stated that, "Education is a social process. Education is growth. Education is, not a preparation for life; education is life itself." I believe he wasn't referring to schools and teachers being at the pinnacle of the hierarchy of important people – he was referring to the willingness and ability to learn from the lessons that life presents. School Fees 2020

In 2020 we will once again be issuing one invoice for fees and levies at the commencement of the school year. Those families who wish to pay in full before the end of March will once again be offered a 3% discount on their school fees. We are endeavouring to have all of our families who do not wish to take advantage of this discount set up on a payment plan prior to the end of this year. This will be a great asset to the school and I believe will benefit all of our children greatly.

I would personally like to thank each and every one of the volunteers that have helped out throughout the year. Without you all we would not have such a successful committee. To all the families who support us, with our fundraising efforts, thank you! If anyone is interested in joining the committee next year, please see myself, Kirrilly or Anita. I know we all lead such busy lives, but if anyone can donate an hour or two a year, that is all we ask. If you can offer more, that's fantastic too. If we all do a little bit, we can achieve great things for our children in our school. That is why we do what we do.




