PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Xi Zhu, the Confucian scholar, stated that, "You should examine yourself daily. If you find faults, you should correct them. When you find none, you should look harder". I doubt whether any of us would be in the rare position of not finding faults in our character, our actions and/or our responses in the course of a day. However, I don't believe Xi Zhu was inferring that the exercise of introspection is the encouragement of self-flagellation; rather the experience of planning for change can be liberating and very 'Lenten' in its intent.

During this time of Lent, we should be even more aware of the value of introspection. However, any and all introspection is empty and wasteful if it fails to lead to some positive action. We all know someone who never gives up. Tenacity, or the ability to keep trying, to be resilient and almost unrelenting in the face of hardships and challenges, is a quality that characterises many of the lives of people we look up to as role models, even as heroes. Louis Pasteur, the famous scientist, stated the maxim common to people of achievement when he said, "Let me tell you the secret that has led me to my goal: my strength lies solely in my tenacity".

Herein lies the great revelation for us – what do the goals that we have set ourselves (and how we go about achieving these goals) reveal about our character? As with no other 'season', Lent compels us to reflect on our character, and often our character is tempered by the goals that drive us and how we seek to achieve these goals. In meeting with staff on a regular basis, I can attest that our staff set themselves goals that are aimed at enhancing learning outcomes for the students in their care. I believe they go about achieving these goals in a sensible and considered manner. There is the realisation, though, that these goals that are established by staff, are reliant on support from families and the cooperation of the children and contingent of school constructs.

The many variables that are subsumed in this process are not unique to education; if our home-school goals and strategies are not complementary, if we are not tenacious and consistent in setting realistic goals that are mutually inclusive, we should not be surprised at a

disappointing outcome. Lent 'permits' us to reflect on our character to allow growth through correction, which offers us much in regards to goal-setting. When we are no longer able to change a situation - we are challenged to change ourselves. Thank you to all in our school community who, through appropriate introspection and thoughtful goal-setting contribute to the 'common good' of our mutual Lenten journey.

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2021 Fee Invoices and Billing IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING THE NEW FINANCE SYSTEM

From 1 March 2021 we are using a new finance system, *TechnologyOne*, that is used by all Catholic primary schools in Tasmania. Points to note include:

ANNUAL & MONTHLY

Next week, or early the following week, you will receive your 2021 Fee Statement via email with your Annual School Fees & Levies charges for this year in addition to any balances owing or credit balances that have been brought over from our old finance system.

Statements will be emailed each month, to the email address registered for you in Compass. Please check we have recorded your charges, discounts and payments correctly to your account.

• POSSIBLE DEBTOR ACCOUNT NAME CHANGE

You may notice that your account name has changed. This may be due to legal requirements around who signed your child's enrolment form, and those people who have parental responsibilities, and if they have a parent profile in *Compass*.

If you have any questions or concerns around this, please get in touch and we will be happy to investigate and clarify the change.

CONCESSION DISCOUNTS

If you are eligible for concessions and have had a Concession Discount confirmed for 2021, this discount has been processed already, and your credit balance will be brought over into the new system and show as a credit opening balance on your statement.

INSTALMENTS

For anyone who has returned the payment arrangement form and opted for a payment arrangement, the system will set 10 x monthly instalments with corresponding due dates for this year's fees only. These instalment amounts and due dates will be printed on the lower half of your statement, with the full annual charges and any opening balances showing at the top of your statement.

Please note, however, that you can continue to pay as per your current payment plan of fortnightly, weekly, monthly. As long as you pay a minimum of these instalments by these due dates your account will not fall into arrears.

If you wish to pay your fees in instalments across the year and have not already set up a payment arrangement, please contact Lennice Leonard, the School Finance Officer, immediately to complete the payment arrangement form and set an instalment plan.

• OUTSTANDING BALANCES

Any outstanding opening balances from last year, are not included in the instalment figures, however, are included in the statement opening balances and your account total. If you do not already have a payment plan in place, please contact Lennice Leonard, the School Finance Officer.

• FEE ASSISTANCE

A reminder that we have fee assistance and concession card discounts available to anyone in our school community who may need to make use of these. While it may be a difficult conversation, we are here to help. Forms are available on our website or contact Lennice Leonard, the School Finance Officer, for a confidential discussion with the principal.

• BPAY CUSTOMER REFERENCE NUMBERS (CRNs)

One point to note for anyone that pays via BPAY; you will notice your new statement will have a new BPAY Customer Reference Number (CRN). This number new number will be active from the 4th March. Until then, you should continue to use your old BPAY CRN number. After this date your old BPAY CRN will no longer be valid.

• EARLY PAYMENT DISCOUNT

Due to invoicing being a little later than usual this year with the cross over into the new system, we have extended the early payment discount date to the 31st March.


Learning Plan Teacher-Parent Meetings (Mrs Marshall Student Support Coordinator)

Home Readers/Levelled Readers

Included in this week's newsletter is a handout that provides families with an overview of student reading levels. Parents should be aware of the following important points that relate to our whole-school approach to the use of home readers/levelled readers:

- All enquiries regarding a child's reading level and his or her engagement in home readers/levelled readers should be undertaken with your child's teacher/s.
- Teachers will endeavour to test each student for their reading level twice a term (this can take up to 40 minutes per child). The teacher will inform parents of any level change that may eventuate from these tests.
- Staff will endeavour to ensure children have a variety of books at their level to borrow, however, there may be times that a child may receive a book that they have already read this is not a concern as children will benefit by reading the same levelled reader twice provided this doesn't occur too frequently.
- Home readers/Levelled readers are changed daily by staff these books should be dropped in the respective class home reader basket.
- A child's level is indicative of fluency (accurate pronunciation, attention to punctuation), confidence with vocabulary and comprehension.
- There is an expectation that children borrow school library books please and that each library day, children will bring a library bag for borrowing.

Parent-Teacher Meetings

Our home-school communication at St Patrick's is conducted a number of ways - on a daily basis through our school diary protocols; through the distribution of student notebooks that contain not only student attempts at tasks but also summative assessment feedback to students in the form of grades and/or rubrics that reflect expected standards regularly throughout each term (an English book was sent home last week and a Mathematics book will be sent home next week.) Teachers plan to engage students in activities that allow students to submit or complete work that the teacher can then grade, provide feedback to the student and use the submission in a growing 'body of evidence' for the eventual 'grade of achievement' for each learner. Our mid-year reports are complemented with the opportunity for parents to meet with teachers to discuss the grades, and the student's application and attitude to tasks. Teachers or parents may request a meeting with parents prior to these mid-year reports and a mutually convenient time will always be organised.

We are currently using the spelling program, "Soundwaves" for our weekly spelling and having been enjoying various activities to reinforce our weekly focus of phonemes and graphemes. We have also been making a big effort towards completing Home-reading and I have been pleased with many students taking up the challenge. In Maths we have been learning about representing, ordering and partitioning numbers. We also had the opportunity to work with Mitch on the Making Jesus Real Program (MJR) and we were able to discuss some of the key messages such as identifying the Gospel values, recognising the Spirit of Jesus in our daily lives and, "Oh yeah" moments.












World's Greatest Shave - Let's support Oliver in raising \$560 towards cancer research.

St Patrick's Catholic School COVID-19 School Safety Protocol

- Adults to please hand sanitise upon entering any school building: the school provides hand sanitiser at school venue entry points or adults may use their own (and be observed to use a sanitiser).
