PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Would you call yourself an explorer? Would those who know you feel that you aren't afraid of adventure, of meeting a challenge? Words are loaded - the terms, 'explore' and 'adventure' are often subconsciously associated with images of breathtaking feats that tests human physical and emotional limits, while the reality for most of us, our adventures are (thankfully) more mundane. Marcel Proust wrote in his Remembrance of things past that 'The only true voyage of discovery is not to go to new places, but to have other eyes.' If exploration, and the adventure that follows, means having new eyes, we can be, and most of us already are, explorers of sometimes epic proportions.

Parenthood, as with education and teaching, implies exploring boundaries and being ready for an adventure. Intrinsic to any adventure is preparation, and preparation implies an awareness of needs. If an exploration is to become an adventure that has triumphs that overshadows the challenges that remain unmet, we require a degree of planning that still may not adequately prepare us for the adventure - it is in such a situation that character is formed. Exploration transforms, just as education and being a member of a community such as school or family transforms, because it provides us with insights not only about our world, but because it provides us with an awareness of our own potential.

Occasionally we feel that we are sea-worthy explorers and we remain 'land-locked' by shifts in unfavourable tides or inclement weather - adventure is as much about achieving the balance between common sense and gritty determination, as it is about thorough preparation. Staff at St Patrick's are involved in continual preparation in regards to supporting students in testing boundaries. Parenthood is one of life's biggest adventures and we are often unprepared; so many factors appear out of our control and the journey can often be a long, hard slog. We need to remind each other that our mutual goal is the enhancement of our students'/children's learning outcomes, which can be achieved without compromising our own welfare provided we prepare and implement our respective journeys with sufficient preparation, tempered with a healthy dose of common sense. I look forward to being part of our collaborative St Patrick's educational adventure throughout 2019.

Student pick-up after school.

Students in Kinder, Prep and Year 1 who are waiting for parents, are expected to wait in their classroom immediately after school, and are then expected to wait at the school office to be picked up by a family member who may be running late.

After-school use of school grounds.

Staff are usually not in a position to provide supervision or intervene after school and it has come to my attention that there is the potential for members of our school community to be injured, and/or for damage to school property to occur, when the school day concludes at 3.00pm and families remain on school premises. Recent incidents have concerned me and I have fielded complaints from members of our school community in regards to what are considered unsafe actions. St Patrick's School also shares our space with the Shamrock Childcare Centre and under their regulations, they can't use the play equipment until families have left, which can be a considerable inconvenience for the childcare centre staff and students. I have mentioned in Newsletters the understanding that children need to be closely supervised by responsible adults, however, it appears that the potential for injury and/or damage is a real concern and, as such, there is now an expectation that families no longer stay after school using school facilities - this decision was not taken lightly. There may be exceptions that may include closely supervised sports' training sessions where families with children may find it convenient to stay and watch, however, these would be exceptions to the rule and there needs to be a clear understanding that parents who are watching the training and who may have children not involved in the training are very closely supervised by the adult. Thank you for your understanding and support. Mr Linhart is available to discuss this decision with you to provide any clarification or elaboration.


REMINDERS & COMMUNITY NEWS
