PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Example serves better than description. Last Friday St Patrick's welcomed three Catholic school principals and the assistant Director: North to our school. The purpose of this visit was to allow these people the opportunity to experience, **by example rather than description**, the community that is St Patrick's Catholic School. It was wonderful to welcome these people to our school, to have them greeted by some of our senior students; to be with them during their tour of the school and their conversations with students; to listen to their insights in regards to our engaging, engaged and welcoming students; and to be affirmed that our WEST values are viewed and experienced as **examples** that complement our numerous endeavours to display and **describe** such values throughout our school.

A most important aspect of this visit and the ensuing discussions, was the nature of the 'conversations of scrutiny', and the opportunity to reflect on practice - principalship has the danger of being removed from the classroom, with the similarity of being a vegan but employed to write a 'meateaters' recipe book - people whose responsibilities have an impact and influence on others, as is the situation with any educator and parent, have an obligation to appreciate the demands of the responsibilities and engagements that characterise the community, whether the community be a family, a school, an organisation or a culture. All of us would do well to emulate the intentions of Napoleon in his efforts to appreciate the views of those for whom he served as Emperor - Napoleon would occasionally disguise himself as a bourgeois or wear poor clothes to walk Paris, asking questions of people; this way, he could know how people felt about him and his policies. As adults, we were all children once, we were all students, and it is a worthwhile exercise to step away from the 'bustle of today' if we can, to reflect on how we can support those whose journeys we have travelled, yet whose demands may be new and of a different challenge.

Mahatma Gandhi is quoted as saying, "Service which is rendered without joy helps neither the servant nor the served. But all other pleasures and possessions pale into nothingness before service which is rendered in a spirit of joy." Regardless of the often conflicting demands upon the role of principal, I can only continue in my role if I continue to experience the real and genuine joy that is characterised by working with the many and varied members of the St Patrick's School community - we test each other; we offer support for each other; we grow together becoming 'new

creatures' as a result of our encounters - thank you to all who appreciate the value of service in being part of a school community such as ours.



Compass for Parents & Guardians

What does Compass do?

Using Compass allows you to access up-to-date and meaningful information about our school and your child's progress. Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Monitor your child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- Receive notifications from the school including newsletters and push notifications (please note
 that we will be phasing out of using Skoolbag over the next six months as Compass will replace
 the Skoolbag app)
- Update your family contact details
- View your child's timetable and the school calendar
- Download and view your child's progress and semester reports
- Book parent-teacher conferences
- View details on, and provide consent for, events and excursions

In the future it will also have the ability to:

- Monitor your child's homework and assessment tasks
- Pay school fees and make other payments



Our school will advise parents when each of these features becomes available for parent use. It is now also a legal requirement that all visitors and volunteers sign in and out. This can be done by using the new Compass Kiosk (pictured above with Mrs Harris) visitors and volunteers <u>must</u> have with them their Working with Vulnerable People card.

Accessing Compass

Compass is a web-based system that is accessible on any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) or by using the Compass iOS (Apple) or Android apps. Search for 'Compass School Manager' in the App or Google Play store.

Every parent/guardian receives a separate login to Compass, which will be provided to you by our school next week, so please keep an eye out.
