PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Searching for excellence is a mantra used by most educators; as parents and teachers we take seriously our roles as being influencers of others. We want others to both share in the particular love of learning and life that we currently experience, and we hope to ensure those for whom we have responsibility avoid some of the challenges that may have compromised our positive search for excellence.

After experiencing dismal results from what they considered the application of 'best pedagogical theories' to a two-year reading program, two American educationalists, Gallimore and Tharp, searched for the 'greatest' or 'best' teacher that they could find. After significant research and discernment, they decided to study John Wooden, an extremely successful basketball coach, and their analysis and conclusions were then applied to the reading program with pleasing success - what attributes did Wooden display that then brought about student excellence that was not apparent in the 'best pedagogical theories'?

Wooden, an unassuming quietly spoken person, permitted the two educationalists to record his coaching and 2326 discrete acts of teaching were observed. A summary of these observations highlighted by Wooden:

- Providing compliments only 6.9% of the time.
- Expressing displeasure only 6.6% of the time.
- Communicating pure information about what to do, how to do it and when to do it 75% of the time.
- Conducting intense, highly structured explicit five to 15 minute drills, during which time there were minimal stoppages and when he did, he rarely spoke longer than 20 seconds.

What Wooden was doing was providing immediate feedback that was concise, explicit and unambiguously accurate; modelling the right skill; correcting if required; remodelling. There are many dimensions that teachers contend with that Wooden did not have to factor-in to his coaching regime, however, his philosophy complements 'cognitive load theory' in that sharply focused explicit teaching and the careful use of formative assessment enhances opportunities for learning and, consequently, excellence. Students are, temperamentally, at various levels of being able to display self-control, be self-directed, self-regulate and self-manage their learning, and the irrefutable fact is that no-one can learn **for** someone else - it is when the student engages in the learning process that has been

carefully crafted by a teacher who is striving for excellence, that we, as parents and teachers, can find delight, because it is the love of learning, coupled with a realisation that there is a responsibility for being intrinsically motivated, that the excellence becomes less about competition and more about complementing a life that is richly satisfying. A timely reminder as reports loom.
