PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

"The purpose of life is not to be happy. It is to be useful, to be honourable, to be compassionate, to have it make some difference that you have lived and lived well." This quote that alludes to 'success' by the nineteenth century essayist and philosopher, Ralph Waldo Emerson, reflects an unselfishness that social scientists in 150 years time who study the early 21st century might find lacking. For five decades, researchers at The Pacific Institute have been studying what comprises success. After all these years of studying and researching, they believe that they can conclude with the utmost confidence that the secret of success is "attitude." People who succeed do not have fewer problems than other people; they do not start out with greater brainpower, or better parents, or more money, either. As a matter of fact, their research identified that sometimes starting out working against incredible odds can act as an enhancer of the resilient, positive attitude that they associated with success. These individuals appeared to have a way of looking at things, a way of seeing obstacles as possibilities, and a way of 'hanging in there' and making the most of every opportunity, which almost guarantees success.

As celebrated climber, Royal Robbins, once reported, "When it's been a long day of climbing, and I feel like I can't go any further, I concentrate on the next metre...and then the next metre...and then the next metre. Pretty soon, I'm at the top." Successful people have the attitude that supports being flexible, optimistic and hard-working. The good news about attitudes is that they can be changed, and we are, to a degree, in charge of our own attitudes. Mother Teresa rose to prominence because she 'thought big, but concentrated on the small.' She famously stated that, "If you cannot feed a hundred people, feed one." As the 'demands' of Christmas step up a notch, we can take great solace from those around us whose positive, compassionate, hospitable, respectful and merciful attitude inspire us. What will be our attitude toward our "next metre?"

2020 Classes - Orientation morning.



Lunch: A BBQ (sausage in bread), drink and icy-pole will be provided to students.


